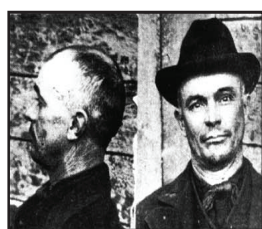

COLD BLOODED KILLERS

Peter Fournier under arrest suspected of being one of the Bouthillette Murderers.

DAWSON - Yesterday Peter Fournier, who was known to have left Whitehorse on June 16th in a small boat with Leon Bouthillette and Guy Joseph Beaudoin, whose bullet pierced bodies were found about a month ago in the Yukon river near Ogilvie, was arrested here. Four hundred dollars in Quebec bank notes were found on his person. The police are hot on the trail of a man named LaBelle, Fournier's partner, and who is also known to have been one of the party when it left Whitehorse.

A man from Whitehorse has identified Fournier as being one of the party of five leaving Whitehorse for Dawson on June 16th inst.

Ed LaBelle, the partner of Peter Fournier, says that Fournier killed the men and threw their bodies into the river while he was absent from camp on a hunting expedition.

REFERRAL OF RECOMMENDATION PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

COFFEE GOLD MINE PROJECT

The Executive Committee of the Yukon Environmental and Socio-economic Assessment Board (YESAB) invites the public to review and comment on the Referral of Recommendation back to the Executive Committee for the proposed Coffee Gold Mine Project. The project is subject to a Screening by the Executive Committee of YESAB under the *Yukon Environmental and Socio-economic Assessment Act* (YESAA).

PROJECT:	Proposed Coffee Gold Project (project number 2017-0211)
PROJECT DESCRIPTION:	The project proposes a 10-year operating period mining up to 67 million tonnes of ore and 330 million tonnes of waste rock. The proposed mine is an open pit mine with a cyanide heap leach facility. The project would be accessed via a 214 km access road from Dawson City.
RECOMMENDATION AND REFERRAL:	The Executive Committee issued its screening report to decision bodies recommending that the project be allowed to proceed without a review, subject to 48 terms and conditions and 10 monitoring requirements identified in the screening report. The Government of Canada has referred the recommendation back to the Executive Committee for reconsideration of four items including the decommissioning of the Northern Access Route (NAR), access controls related to the NAR, water quality and cumulative effects.

Work To Be Resumed

On The Anaconda, Rabbit Foot and White Horse Group Mines For Which Large Sums Have Been Offered and Refused

The excellent returns from Messrs. Graingers & McIntyre's properties has given a fresh impetus to copper mining in the White Horse district, and in the course of the next two or three weeks a force of men will be put to work on the Anaconda mine, which has already had sufficient development done to prove it equally rich as the Copper King.

The group of mines comprising the Anaconda, Rabbit Foot and White Horse, is owned by Messrs. J.P. Whitney, A. P. Benton, Ole Dickson, W.A. Pucket, Charley Ward and O'Neil. Of these the Anaconda is the furthest advanced in development, 135 feet of tunnel having already been run, besides numerous cross-cuts and several shafts to a depth of 20 feet.

Last June \$100,000 was offered and refused for the Anaconda and five weeks ago an offer of \$150,000 for the Anaconda and Rabbit Foot was also declined.

The lode on which these claims are located shows an average width of 75 feet, and assays from picked ore have given values as high as \$258 per ton.

At the Anaconda there are now about 100 tons of ore on the dump, but the owners have decided not to ship any of it at present, and will wait for the erection of a smelter close at hand which has every indication of being an accomplished fact during the coming summer.
