MARTHA BENJAMIN:
CANADIAN CHAMP

“Martha beats them all” a STAR headline proclaimed in 1963 when an Old Crow skier and mother of five children became the first Yukoner to win a national skiing title.

Twenty-five year old Martha Benjamin won the senior women’s cross country skiing title at the Canadian championships in Midland, Ontario. Her time over the 10 kilometre race was 43.29 minutes. And in 1989, 26 years after that historic event, Benjamin was inducted in the Yukon Sports Hall of Fame. “After all these years, I didn’t expect to receive something like this,” she said. “I just had it in me that I wanted to do it, and I did it,” she said of her win in Midland Ontario.

Benjamin and Ben Charlie were the only two skiers to attend the championships. Charlie ranked 11th in a field of 48. His toughest competition came from a group of Finns from Sudbury who swept the field.


Both skiers brought high credit and distinction (not to mention the publicity) to their community and to the Yukon as a whole. Star correspondent Edith Josie wrote before they left: “I had wire from Mr. Harry at Whitehorse. He said Ben Charlie and Mrs. Martha Benjamin will go to Ottawa for International Olympic Competition for skiers on February 13. Frank Cook will take them out. Everyone is very glad to hear these two will go out long travel. Hope they had good trip. Old Crow is little town and Father Mouchet is training boys and girls for the skiers. Now they even go way out to Ottawa. Sure big surprise for the people in Old Crow.”

Mouchet, an experienced ski instructor for the French army, designed a training program which is now called TEST (Territorial Experimental Ski Training). This program strives to stimulate and motivate children to discover themselves, develop self-reliance through a rigorous training schedule and gain self-confidence through a series of tough, but surmountable challenges.

COLD BLOODED
KILLERS

Peter Fournier under arrest
suspected of being one of the
Bouthillette Murderers.

DAWSON - Yesterday Peter Fournier, who was known to have left Whitehorse on June 16th in a small boat with Leon Bouthillette and Guy Joseph Beaudoin, whose bullet pierced bodies were found about a month ago in the Yukon river near Ogilvie, was arrested here. Four hundred dollars in Quebec bank notes were found on his person. The police are hot on the trail of a man named LaBelle, Fournier’s partner, and who is also known to have been one of the party when it left Whitehorse. A man from Whitehorse has identified Fournier as being one of the party of five leaving Whitehorse for Dawson on June 16th inst.

Ed LaBelle, the partner of Peter Fournier, says that Fournier killed the men and threw their bodies into the river while he was absent from camp on a hunting expedition.

CPA DEATH TOLL 52

Canadian Pacific Airline’s Flight 21 exploded and crashed last Thursday afternoon on its way north from Vancouver, killing all 52 people aboard. Five Whitehorse residents were among the dead. Seven other northern families suffered losses. It was the first fatal crash on the northern run.

The DC-6B was fifty miles north of Ashcroft B.C. and thirty miles west of 100 Mile House when eye witnesses said there appeared to be an explosion, the tail section dropped off and the plane plummeted into the ground. A pall of smoke was spotted by B.C. Forestry lookouts and a small aircraft dispatched to the scene minutes later. The crash occurred just before five o’clock.

At 4:40, about 15 minutes before the crash, the captain radioed that he was changing course slightly to avoid turbulence. Moments later, the stricken aircraft made three desperate “Mayday” calls to the Prince George airport. Then silence.

The plane left Vancouver at 3:30 p.m. and was scheduled to land at Prince George at 5:20. It had not yet picked up other connecting passengers at Fort St. John.

News of the disaster spread quickly in Whitehorse and anxious families here kept long distance telephone lines jammed for several hours. CPA officials and RCMP officers contacted next of kin as soon as the passenger list had been verified from Vancouver.
