DAWSON CRIMINAL RE-CAPTURED  
AFTER A YEAR'S HUNT

SWAN HARRISON, AN INSANE PATIENT ARRESTED IN THE  
NORTHWEST TERRITORIES

Swan Harrison, who escaped from the Northwest  
Mounted police at Selkirk on the Yukon a year ago,  
has just been captured by members of the same ef-  
ficient force at a point thousands of miles distant. Harrison  
has been taken a prisoner in the Northwest territories.

A telegram has been received by Major Wood at Daw-  
son telling him of the capture of Harrison.

When Harrison escaped at Selkirk he was being taken  
out of the Yukon to New Westminster, B.C. as an insane  
patient. He had been arrested and convicted at Dawson  
some time before for stealing, had become insane while  
in prison and was transferred to the lunatic ward.

While the steamer was lying at Selkirk Harrison made  
a leap from the boat, and landing partly in the water  
walked ashore, scrambled away up the bank and ran into  
the woods before he could be overtaken. He and a num-  
ber of other lunatics were in charge of Corpl. Stewart on  
the trip up the river. A short search was made for Harri-  
son, but he could not be found, and the boat proceeded  
with the remainder of the party.

From traces obtained it is believed he went down  
the Yukon river and escaped by way of St. Michael or  
Nome. He is said to be from the States, but how it is that  
he should wander over into the Northwest Territories  
is scarcely understood. It was thought at first from the  
point at which the fellow turned up he must have tak-  
en a chance at the famous Edmonton trail and gotten  
through, but the idea is scarcely credited.

FIRST AIRCRAFT

Whitehorse Paved the Way for Aviation in the North.

For a history of aviation in the Yukon Territory we have to go back to June, 1920, when Capt. H.T. Douglas of the U.S. Air Force and Capt. H.A. Leroyer of the Canadian Air Board arrived in Whitehorse to talk over a proposed international aeroplane flight from Mineola, N.Y. to Nome Alaska. They both came with the authority of their respective governments to make all necessary arrangements for landing places, fuel, supplies, etc. In commenting on the proposed flight the Whitehorse STAR of that day described it as "an event that will go down in history as one of the most daring conceptions of the potentialities of aerial flight that has ever been conceived since the possibilities of a lighter-than-air craft as a means of transportation became, through the inventive genius of man, a certainty."



WIDOW ESCAPES AS FIRE GUTS ARLINGTON

A chance visit by Jim Toohey on his way from his home at Sulphur to Dawson probably saved the life of Mrs. Harry McDonnell Wednesday night when the Arlington Roadhouse burned to the ground. The Arlington is a Dawson landmark 10 miles from town, famous for years for its hospitality.

Toohey had dropped in to see the pioneer widow shortly before she noticed sparks dropping into the living room from the stovepipe safety. The pair rushed upstairs to find the top floor ablaze. Flames shot fiercely through the tinder dry building so quickly Mrs. McDonnell had time only to grab a few dresses and blankets. The fire truck and many volunteers sped to the scene through sixty-below weather from Bear Creek but the old-time roadhouse burned to the ground.

The McDonnell's were Gold Rush pioneers and the Arlington known to hundreds of Yukoners, was built during the Gold Rush days.
