LEGAL

OFFICIAL COURT NOTICE

Were you a student of Jack Hulland Elementary School ("JHES") between January 1, 2002 and June 30, 2022 and subjected to a hold, restraint and/or placed in seclusion?

If so, your rights are affected by a class action lawsuit.

WHAT IS A CLASS ACTION?

A class action is a lawsuit filed by one person on behalf of a group of people with the same legal claims.

WHAT IS THIS CLASS ACTION ABOUT?

A class action lawsuit has been brought against the Government of Yukon ("Yukon") and the Jack Hulland Elementary School Council of Area #22 ("JHES School Council"). The class action claims that there was a systemic practice of using holds, restraints and seclusion to control students' behaviour at Jack Hulland.

AM I A CLASS MEMBER?

You are a **Class Member** of the continuing class action against Yukon if you were a student of JHES between **January 1, 2007** and **June 30, 2022**, and you were subjected to a hold, restraint, and/or you were locked in a room and/or placed in seclusion.

You are a **Settlement Class Member** of the settled class action against the Jack Hulland School Council if you were a student of JHES between **January 1, 2002** and **June 30, 2022**, and you were subjected to a hold, restraint and/or you were locked in a room and/or placed in seclusion.

If you think you may be a Class Member and/or a Settlement Class Member or if you have questions, please contact the lawyers below.

AM I ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE MONEY?

There are no funds to pay to class members at this time. However, you should keep any records you have about your experience at JHES.

WHAT DO I DO NOW?

If you do not want to participate in the class action and the settlement with JHES School Council, you must opt out.

- If you opt out, you can bring your own lawsuit against Yukon or the JHES School Council subject to strictly enforced time limits called limitation periods.

- The lawyers have sought a court order for production of student records from JHES. If you do not want your records disclosed to the lawyers you can exclude yourself from this class action and opt-out;

- If you opt out, you will not be bound by the result of this class action.

- If you opt out, you will not be able to make a claim for any money that results from this class action.

If you do nothing you will be included in the class action.

- If you do nothing you cannot bring your own lawsuit against Yukon for negligence, recklessness or breach of fiduciary duty.

- If you do nothing you cannot bring your own lawsuit against the School Council for negligence, recklessness, breach of fiduciary duty, assault, battery, or false imprisonment.

- If you do nothing your student records may be produced to the lawyers.

- If you do nothing you will be bound by the result of this action.

- If you do nothing you may be able to make a claim for any money that results from this class action.

How do I opt out?

- You must send a completed opt-out form to lawyers for the class by August 23, 2024.

- Opt-out forms are available at www.tucker.carruthers.ca/jack-hulland-elementary, or can be requested from lawyers for the class.

- You have 30 days from the day you send in your opt-out form to revoke your opt-out by sending written instructions to the Class lawyers.

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

The class action is not over. The next step is a trial where the Court will decide common issues of fact and law in a common issues trial.

If the class action succeeds:

- notice of the result of the common issues trial and what will happen next will be distributed;

- the Court will decide what steps, if any, are required to prove your individual claim;

- individual issue trials may be required; and

- the lawyers will seek court approval of their legal fees, plus expenses incurred in pursuing the class action.

TORNADO HITS WATSON LAKE

What has been described as being a phenomena in this part of Canada occurred on Wednesday, September 9 between two and 3:00 p.m. when a tornado formed over Watson lake, raced down the far shore opposite the airport and up the bank to dissipate somewhere in the bush by the tank farm.

The tornado was accompanied by a short but extremely heavy hail storm with some of the stones measuring three-quarters of an inch in diameter.

Pete Koszuk, the only known eye-witness to the forming of the tornado said the water began to swirl and gradually lift off the surface.

Evidence of its violence can be seen on the path it took when it struck the lake shore. Poplar, jack pine and spruce trees varying in height 30 to 70 feet and four to 10 inches in diameter were uprooted and piled together like matches. Fortunately the tornado struck only the lake and the trees.

YUKON'S GREAT SHOWING

Yukon Territory's contribution to the Empire and Allied cause in this war is nothing short of magnificent.

Despite the fact the region is remote and the people are engaged in struggling against primitive and exceptionally obdurate and severe conditions in pioneering, they have more than held their own in the war game.

Between four and five hundred men have gone from this territory direct to the war, meaning practically ten per cent of the population of Yukon are under arms in Europe. Were the whole of the Dominion, with its eight million people, to contribute in like proportion to Yukon there would be 800,000 men, or just twice as many enlisted from Canada today as there are. ...

The generous and patriotic spirit of Yukon deserves to be known throughout the Empire and Allied realm. If all the Empire were contributing in like proportion in men and money the assembled wealth and armies today would be far greater than they are. But these matters will adjust themselves.

Yukoners will continue to do a mighty share and uphold the tradition that the sons and daughters of the North are excelled by none in loyalty to the nation and to humanity.
